

POSITION: Journeyman Electrician, Baggage Handling System

SALARY: \$40.99 Hourly

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Are you a Journeyman Electrician with a strong mechanical aptitude? Do you enjoy troubleshooting? If so, this may be the job for you! The BHS Electricians at the Port of Portland are charged with keeping the automated Baggage Handling System at Portland International Airport operational. Daily duties include calibrating equipment, performing preventative maintenance, and responding to emergency breakdowns.

Hours are set by seniority shift bid per the labor agreement. All shifts include one weekend day, either a Saturday or a Sunday. Successful candidate must be available to work a set day, swing, or graveyard shift. This position will remain open until filled.

NOTE: If you are a Journeyman Electrician licensed in Arkansas, Idaho, Maine, Montana, Utah or Wyoming please let us know when you submit your application. The State of Oregon will grant reciprocity from these six states and you may qualify for a reciprocal license. If selected for this position, the Port of Portland will cover the cost of your reciprocal license application fee.

SUMMARY OF ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Performs repairs, calibrations, maintenance and parts replacement to the Port's automated baggage handling system and associated systems. Including, but not limited to:
 - Perform preventative maintenance
 - Install and maintain various electrical and mechanical systems as needed
 - Calibrate equipment
 - Monitor system performance
 - Trouble shoot problems
 - Replace worn parts
 - Evaluate system condition and performance
 - Perform emergency repairs
 - Tracking and replacing baggage belts
 - Support operational contingency plans as required
 - Maintain a clean working environment
 - Maintain tools and instruments
 - Work in a safe manner following all safety protocols and requirements
- Maintain the Baggage Handling System (BHS) to 99% availability with a 3 minute response time.
- Maintain the automated passenger exit control system.
- Maintain vacuum assisted drain system.
- Maintain security and limited access to BHS and screening equipment.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Oregon State General Electrical Journeyman license or Manufacturing Plant Electrical license is required.
- Ability to obtain and maintain eligibility for unescorted access to secure areas of the airport is required.
- Valid driver's license is required.
- Preferred skills:
 - Familiarity with computers and PLC's for troubleshooting and adjusting.
 - Knowledge of mechanical drives, sorting, and scanning devices.
 - Experience working in an commercial or industrial setting.
 - Welding certification or skills.

SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Must possess strong troubleshooting skills.
- Fully proficient with personal computer.
- Strong mechanical aptitude.
- Proven team player who shows the utmost respect for others.
- Ability to:
 - Work in tight spaces and at heights.
 - Work in noisy, heated environment in and around fast moving equipment.
 - Lift and move up to 100 pounds with or without assistance.
 - Follow instructions and meet deadlines in a fast paced working environment.
 - Work independently, with little or no supervision.
 - Exercise good judgment in the absence of specific direction.
 - Communicate well both orally and in writing.
 - Demonstrate commitment to valuing differences among individuals and passion for being inclusive.
 - Work cooperatively with internal and external customers including the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), Airport Operations Supervisors (AOS), Portland Airline Consortium (PAC), airport tenants, and airline personnel.
