- 3. Operates a personal computer and related software; operates trucks and other vehicles; maintains shop including cleaning and organizing tools and shop equipment.

- 1. Draw rough sketches of electrical projects; read and work from sketches, plans, drawings, schematics, technical manuals, specifications and blueprints.
- 2. Work cooperatively with co-workers, site and District office staff, students and others; communicate clearly and effectively; understand and follow oral and written directions; maintain records; schedule and perform work to meet established time lines; work independently with little direction; learn characteristics of a wide variety of types and makes of electronic equipment; operate trucks and other vehicles; learn and perform duties of other trades if assigned; serve as lead on larger projects.
- 3. Identify and execute electrical system preventative maintenance (PM) procedures to prevent breakdowns, prolong equipment life and minimize interruptions impacting the customer.
- 4. Troubleshoot total building electrical systems to identify and correct system or equipment problems.
- 5. Assemble, install, test, and maintain electrical or electronic wiring, equipment, appliances, apparatus, and fixtures, using hand tools and power tools.
- 6. Diagnose malfunctioning systems, apparatus, and components, using test equipment and hand tools, to locate the cause of a breakdown and correct the problem. Advise management on whether continued operation of equipment could be hazardous.
- 7. Inspect electrical systems, equipment, and components to identify hazards, defects, and the need for adjustment or repair, and to ensure compliance with codes.
- 8. Test electrical systems and continuity of circuits in electronic wiring, equipment, and fixtures, using testing devices such as ohmmeters, voltmeters, to ensure compatibility and safety of system.
- 9. Plan layout and installation of electrical wiring, equipment and fixtures, based on job specifications and local codes.
- 10. Inspect, test, maintain logs and post required permits for building electrical systems according to code and industry standards.
- 11. If assigned, direct and train workers to install, maintain, or repair equipment, and fixtures.
- 12. Prepare sketches or follow blueprints to determine the location of wiring and equipment and to ensure conformance to building and safety codes.
- 13. Maintains records and files, prepares reports, and orders supplies and equipment when assigned.
- 14. Use a variety of tools and equipment such as power construction equipment, measuring devices, power tools, and testing equipment.
